Peter Briggs Peter works as a NHS Consultant in Restorative and Implant Dentistry at St. George's Hospital, London and also runs a Specialist Referral Practice. He qualified from King's in 1983 and was appointed as Consultant in 1995. He was awarded a Winston Churchill Fellowship in 1994. Working within the South West London Maxillo-Facial hub centre his main clinical interests are the multi-disciplinary management of high priority patient groups (Trauma, Developmental Disorders & Oncology). His main specialist referral practice interests include: Implantology, Endodontics and Prosthodontics. He was Clinical Director of the Maxillo-Facial and Dental Unit for 14 years (stopping in 2011). In London, he holds programme training roles for Core Dental Trainees and Specialist Training Registrars in Restorative Dentistry (Pan London STC chair / Sector Lead SL TPD). In 2009 he was proud to be appointed as programme director of the first DwES (Endodontics) training programme within the UK. He is the 2014/5 President of the British Society of Prosthodontics and has served that society on its Council, as CPD / Webinar advisor and Pan Dental Organiser (2011). He presently sits on the organising panel of the 2016 Pan Dental Society meeting. Peter is known as reflective educator who does not like to clinically stand-still or stagnate. Peter has examined and published broadly – he was especially proud to co-author of a Cochrane review in 2012. He was last invited to speak to the BSRD in 2000.



Susan Cunningham Susan Cunningham graduated from Leeds University, UK, in 1988. Her orthodontic training was undertaken at the Eastman Dental Institute in London, gaining an MSc in 1994, Membership in Orthodontics in 1995 and PhD in 2000. She is now Professor of Orthodontics/ Honorary Consultant at the UCL Eastman Dental Institute and is Programme Director of the postgraduate orthodontic programme, one of the largest postgraduate programmes in Europe. She is involved in all aspects of postgraduate orthodontic education in the UK and Europe. She is on the Board of Trustees of the British Orthodontic Society and is honorary secretary of the European Orthodontic Society.

Her main research interests are in the psychology of dentofacial deformity and the outcomes of orthodontic and orthognathic treatment. She has published around 85 original research papers and contributed to a number of specialist textbooks.



Serpil Djemal Serpil is consultant and clinical lead in Restorative Dentistry at Kings College Dental Hospital. She is also clinical lead for adult dental trauma working in the first dedicated unit in the UK working with a multidisciplinary team providing acute and long-term management for adults presenting with dental trauma. In addition to her wealth of clinical experience, Serpil is a Dental Postgraduate Tutor at King's and is active in additional roles within the Royal Colleges. She was President of the British Society for Restorative Dentistry in 2008–2009. She has been a member of the Board of Dental Protection Limited since 2011.



Terry Donovan Dr. Terry Donovan received his DDS from the University of Alberta in 1967, and practiced full time in Regina, Saskatchewan for 13 years. He received his Certificate in Advanced Prosthodontics from the University of Southern California in 1981. He was formerly Professor and Director of the Advanced Education in Prosthodontics Program at USC and was Chair of the Department of Restorative Dentistry there for many years. He was also the Associate Dean for General Practice and Executive Associate Dean for Academic Affairs. He is currently Professor and Section Head for Biomaterials, Department of Operative Dentistry at the University of North Carolina School of Dentistry at Chapel Hill. He has published extensively, and has lectured worldwide on restorative dentistry and materials science. He is a member of the ADA, CDA, North Carolina Dental Society, CAIC, the American Academy of Restorative Dentistry, and a Fellow of the American College of Dentists. He is an honorary life member of the College of Dental Surgeons of Saskatchewan, the Association of Prosthodontists of Canada, the Canadian Academy of Restorative Dentistry and Prosthodontics, the American Dental Society of Europe and the Western Canada Dental Society. He is past Chairman of the American Dental Association's Council on Dental Materials, Instruments and Equipment.



Stephen A Fayle Stephen qualified from Bristol University in 1982, became a Consultant in Paediatric Dentistry in 1995 and is currently a Consultant and Honorary Senior Clinical Lecturer in Paediatric Dentistry based at Leeds Dental Institute, UK. Although most of his career has been spent in the hospital service, he has also worked in General Dental Practice and the Community Dental Service. He is a Past-President of the British Society of Paediatric Dentistry and has recently completed his term as Chair of the SAC in Paediatric Dentistry. He is a member of the Faculty Board of the FDS RCS and is Chair of the National Consultants in Paediatric Dentistry Group



Regina Mericske-Stern Prof. R. Mericske is Chair of the Department of Prosthodontics, University of Bern. Here she received her undergraduate training in dentistry and the PhD degree. Today she is the Director of the Master Program in Prosthodontics and Implant dentistry. The students elected her teacher of the year. She was a regular guest professor at the Dental School of Toronto and has lectured worldwide in over 25 countries. She is a member of various national and international societies: honorary member of the Japanese Association of Implantology, past-president of the international College of Prosthodontists and European Prosthodontic association (ICP and EPA). Currently she is the president of the Swiss Society of Reconstructive Dentistry (SSRD). Her activities, both in clinical practice and clinical research, cover the field of oral implantology, prosthodontics and geriatric dentistry. These are represented in many publications, abstracts and book chapters.



Ian Needleman Ian divides his week between specialist periodontal practice at PerioLondon and the Unit of Periodontology at the UCL Eastman Dental Institute where he is Professor of Restorative Dentistry and Evidence-Based Healthcare and Honorary Consultant in Periodontology with UCLH Trust. His research has been awarded prizes by the European Federation of Periodontology, Royal Society of Medicine, German Periodontal Society, German Cochrane Centre and International Association for Dental Research and he was nominated by graduate students as an inspiring teacher at UCL in 2007. His most recent study is an investigation of the oral health of athletes participating at the London 2012 Olympic Games and the effect of oral health on training and elite performance. Ian is also an editor with the Cochrane Oral Health Group and has worked with NICE, the UK Department of Health and the Scottish Executive on national guidelines and initiatives. He has provided training for a number of groups in industry and healthcare including the European Federation of Periodontology, American Academy of Periodontology, Swiss Dental Association, Spanish Society of Periodontology and the ITI Foundation. His research focuses on improving outcomes of periodontal therapy.

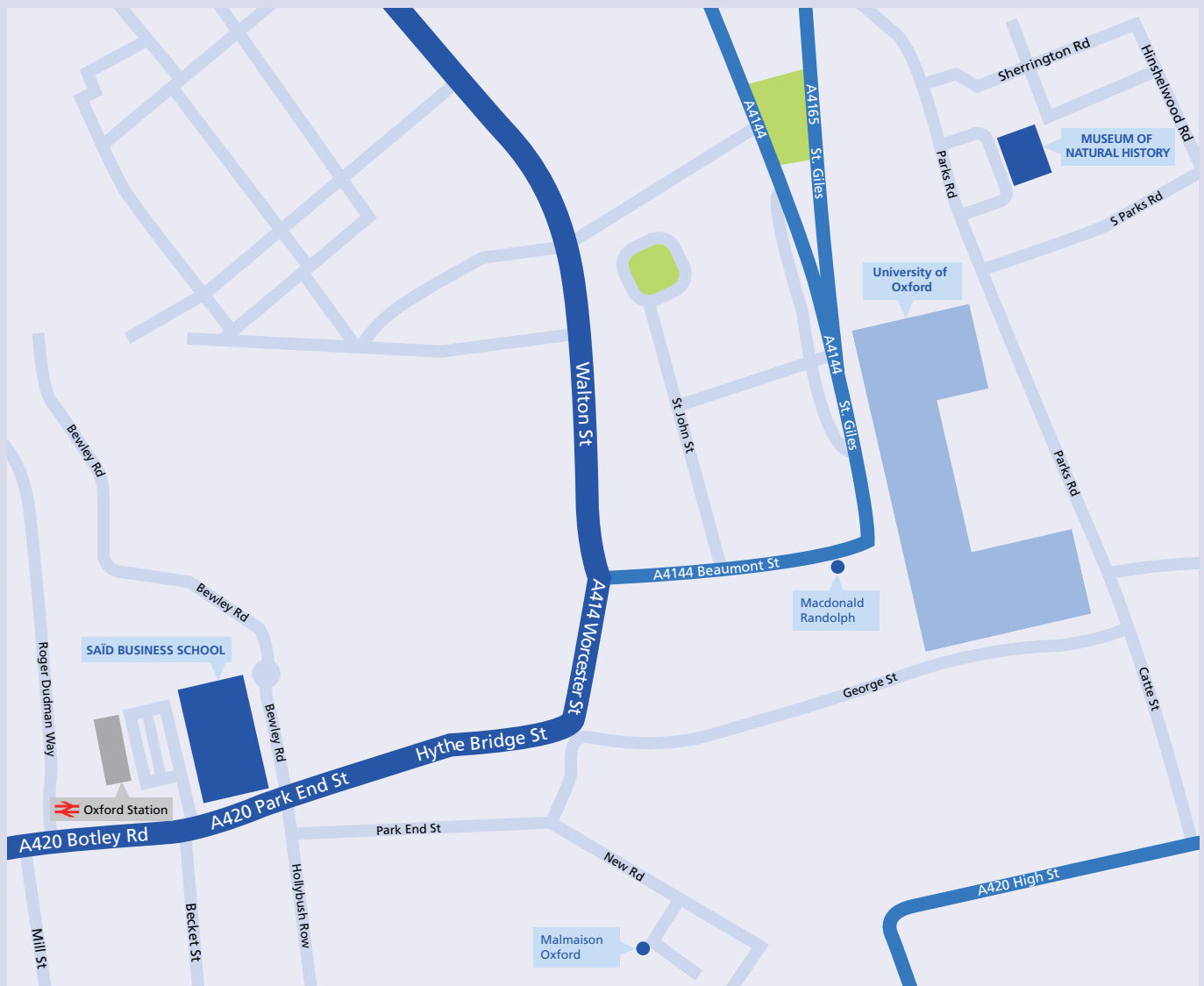
