SPEAKERS



David Bartlett qualified at Birmingham Dental School in 1986 and after a 6 month house job joined the Royal Army Dental Corps as a general practitioner for 3 years. After a number of house jobs he joined UMDS in 1991 as a Lecturer in Conservative Dentistry and is now a Reader and Consultant at Kings College London. He is Head of Postgraduate Prosthodontics and is responsible for 16 trainees from the UK and overseas. His research interest is tooth wear, specifically dental erosion, and he completed his PhD in 1995 investigating the relationship between reflux disease and dental erosion. He has published around 100 articles on tooth wear, dental erosion and other restorative subjects in national and international dental and medical journals. He became a Reader and Honorary Consultant in 1999. He lives in Kent with his wife Anitha, also a graduate of Birmingham, and two children Alexander and Shonalea.



Peter Floyd has been in the same specialist practice since 1973 and is on the specialist list in Periodontics. The practice "Periodontics UK" is in London's West End and is limited to periodontology and the surgical aspects of implant dentistry. Peter usually spends part of each week teaching periodontology and is currently Senior Specialist Clinical Teacher in Periodontology at Guy's. He lectures widely, both nationally and internationally, most recently at Europerio5 in Madrid last year.



Ignace E. Naert graduated as a dentist (LDS) at the Catholic University of Leuven (K.U. Leuven) in 1977. Since then, he joined the Department of Prosthetic Dentistry of the K.U. Leuven and is currently a full professor in the Faculty of Medicine and Chairman of the Department of Prosthetic Dentistry within the School of Dentistry, Oral Pathology and Maxillo-facial Surgery. He teaches fixed prosthodontics at the undergraduate, graduate (MSc Prosthetic Dentistry and MSc Restorative Dentistry) and post-graduate levels. His research interests focus on: clinical follow-up studies of prosthetic treatments, animal studies conducted to improve the outcome of oral implants in bone of low density and the impact of implant loading on bone (re-)modelling. He has (co-)authored more than 150 papers in peer reviewed journals and (co-)authored several text books in the field.



David Ricketts qualified at Guys Hospital Dental School, now Kings College London, in 1986. Following an Oral Surgery House Officer Post and two years in general practice he returned to Guys to study for an MSc in Conservative Dentistry under the guidance of Prof. Bernard Smith. During this, his interest in cariology, and in particular caries diagnosis and its appropriate management, began and led to a PhD which was gained in 1995. These two posts were the initial inspiration for a career in academic dentistry and in 1999 David moved to Dundee Dental School where, following a training pathway in Restorative Dentistry, he was promoted to Senior Lecturer / Honorary Consultant in 2003. David publishes widely on aspects of cariology and restorative dentistry, including contributions to the textbook "Clinical Problem Solving in Dentistry" by Odell and a series of publications in the British Dental Journal on the restoration of the endodontically treated tooth.



Paul Sharpe is the Dickinson Professor of Craniofacial Biology and Director of Research at the Dental Institute, Kings College London. He graduated with a degree in Biology from York University (1977) and a PhD in Biochemistry from Sheffield University (1981). He became Lecturer in Molecular Embryology at the University of Manchester in 1987 and following promotion to Reader in 1991 he was recruited to his present Chair at the Dental Institute where he established a new basic research department, the Department of Craniofacial Development. He has published in excess of 200 research papers and supervised over 30 PhD students. In 2001 having obtained seed funding to develop stem cell based approaches for tooth renewal, he founded a university spin-out company, Odontis, which has recently raised its second round of funding. His basic research work continues to explore the genetic interactions that control tooth development. In 2004 he was awarded the Craniofacial Biology Research Award by the International Association for Dental Research in recognition of his contribution to the understanding of how teeth develop and in 2006 his paper "Stem cell-based tissue engineering of teeth" received the William J Gies award for best publication in Biomaterials and Bioengineering from the same organisation.



Terry Walton graduated with a Bachelor of Dentistry from the University of Sydney in 1974. He gained a Master of Dental Science from the University of Sydney in 1979 and a Master of Science (Prosthodontics) from the University of Michigan in 1982. He is a Fellow of the International College of Dentists, a Fellow of the Pierre Fauchard Academy and a Fellow of the Royal Australasian College of Dental Surgeons. He held the positions of Tutor and Lecturer in the Operative Dentistry Department, University of Sydney (1974-1979) and Specialist Prosthodontist at the Westmead Dental Clinical School (1983) before commencing private specialist prosthodontic practice in Sydney in 1984. He is currently in private practice, but has an appointment as Clinical Associate Professor in Clinical Dentistry at the University of Sydney. He teaches in the Graduate Prosthodontics programme of the University of Sydney and is involved in the Planning Committees for both the prosthodontic programme and the Diploma of Oral Implants programme. He is a member of many dental organizations and has held various committee positions including Co-President of the International College of Prosthodontists in 2000-2001. He is involved in long-term outcome studies of tooth and implant-supported prostheses, has published several papers in refereed journals and was awarded the Paper of the Year by the International Journal of Prosthodontics in 2002. He has been involved in research into thermal expansion properties and leucite development in dental porcelain and has delivered lectures, seminars and workshops to many groups and organizations both in Australia and overseas. He is also a reviewer for the International Journal of Prosthodontics.
