Speakers



Tomas Albrektsson Researcher & Head of Bone Research Group at the Laboratory of Experimental Biology, Department of Anatomy, University of Göteborg, Sweden 1980 – 1986. Researcher and Head of Administration, Institute for Applied Biotechnology, Gothenburg, 1980-1986. Professor and Head of Department of Handicap Research (nowadays Dept. of Biomaterials), University of Göteborg since 1986. Chairman of the Department since 1988, today which is now a part of the Dept of Clinical Sciences, Sahlgren's Academy, Göteborg University Commissions of Trust



Nick Capp qualified at Guy's in 1979 and after house jobs in prosthodontics completed an M.S. in Restorative Dentistry in Michigan in 1983. On his return from the USA Nick taught at The Eastman before starting in private practice in London. He retains a teaching appointment at The Eastman and has lectured and published widely in the fields of fixed prosthodontics and occlusion.



Martin Kelleher is a Consultant in Restorative Dentistry at Kings College London Dental Institute. He is a past president of the British Society for Restorative Dentistry. He was on the Board of Dental Protection for 10 years and was President of Southern Counties Branch of the BDA 2008 - 2009. He is on the GDC specialist lists in Restorative Dentistry and Prosthodontics. He is a dental fellow of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow and the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh. He is the author of many peer reviewed papers and a book on Dental Bleaching published by Quintessence 2008. He is in private practice in Bromley.



Paul McCabe graduated from UCC in 1987 and spent four years in general practice in the UK. He completed an M.Sc in Restorative Dentistry at the University of Manchester in 1992. He completed the M.G.D.S., R.C.S.I in 1997 and limited his practice in Oranmore to endodontics in 2000, completing an M.Sc.D in endodontics in 2004 in Cardiff. He was appointed as an honorary lecturer at Cardiff University in 2004 and is on the GDC specialist list in Endodontics. He has several publications in peer reviewed journals and has lectured widely in Ireland and the UK on endodontic related topics. He relocated his endodontic practice to a custom built unit in 2008 also in Oranmore, Co. Galway. Paul is currently the assistant editor of the clinical section of the International Endodontic Journal.



Keith Moore has worked as the Royal Society's Librarian since July 2005, a post that dates back to the early 1670s. As curatorial head of the Royal Society's collections, Keith is responsible for the most iconic set of scientific objects in the world. These include, for example, the manuscripts of Sir Isaac Newton's *Principia Mathematica* and the original account of the apple tree story of gravity. In addition to conventional collection work to aid academics, Keith has cultivated a more collaborative approach with users by developing a history of science programme during the period 2005-2010: comprising lectures for the public, academic conferences, podcasts, exhibitions, blogs and many other events and activities.



Derek Richards is Director of the Centre for Evidence-based Dentistry, Editor of the Evidence-based Dentistry Journal, Consultant in Dental Public Health with Forth Valley Health Board and Honorary Senior Lecturer at Glasgow Dental Hospital. Derek qualified from Cardiff Dental School in 1977 and came to public health dentistry after working in hospital, general and community dental practice. He helped to establish both the Centre for Evidence-based Dentistry and the Evidence-based Dentistry Journal. Derek is a specialist advisor to the Scottish Dental Clinical Effectiveness programme and was also involved in the York Review of water fluoridation and the NICE dental recall guideline. He has been involved with teaching EBD and a wide range of evidence-based initiatives both nationally and internationally since 1994.



Jimmy Steele graduated in dentistry from Dundee in 1985. After hospital appointments in Dundee, Perth and Glasgow and obtaining FDS in 1988, he was appointed as a lecturer in Restorative Dentistry in Newcastle in 1989. His PhD was awarded in 1994. He was made a personal Senior Lecturer in Restorative Dentistry in 1999 and then a personal chair in Oral Health Services Research in 2003. He is also a clinical dental specialist and works as Consultant in Restorative Dentistry in Newcastle. His experience in the epidemiology of adult dental health is extensive and has included leading roles in several large scale national surveys (including NDNS 65+, ADHS 1998 and 2009/10 and CDHS 2003). His health services research includes primary care, quality of life and health economics. He is oral and dental lead for the UKCRN. In 2009 he led the Independent Review of NHS Dental Services in England for the Secretary of State for Health. He is currently head of Newcastle Dental School.



William Wade is Professor of Oral Microbiology at King's College London, Consultant Clinical Scientist in Microbiology to Guy's and St Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust and Honorary Senior Research Investigator at the Forsyth Institute, Boston, USA. He qualified in Microbiology in 1978 at the University of East Anglia. He pursued a PhD in Oral Microbiology at Cardiff Dental School and was appointed to a lectureship there in 1987. He then moved to the University of Bristol to take up a Senior Lectureship in Oral Microbiology and from there to take up his current position in 1996. He has published widely in the fields of oral, medical and general microbiology and received substantial external funding from UK Research Councils, charities and industry. His current interests include the molecular characterisation of the oral microbiome in health and disease, clinical Oral Microbiology and the development and evaluation of antimicrobials for the prevention and treatment of oral diseases.

Venue

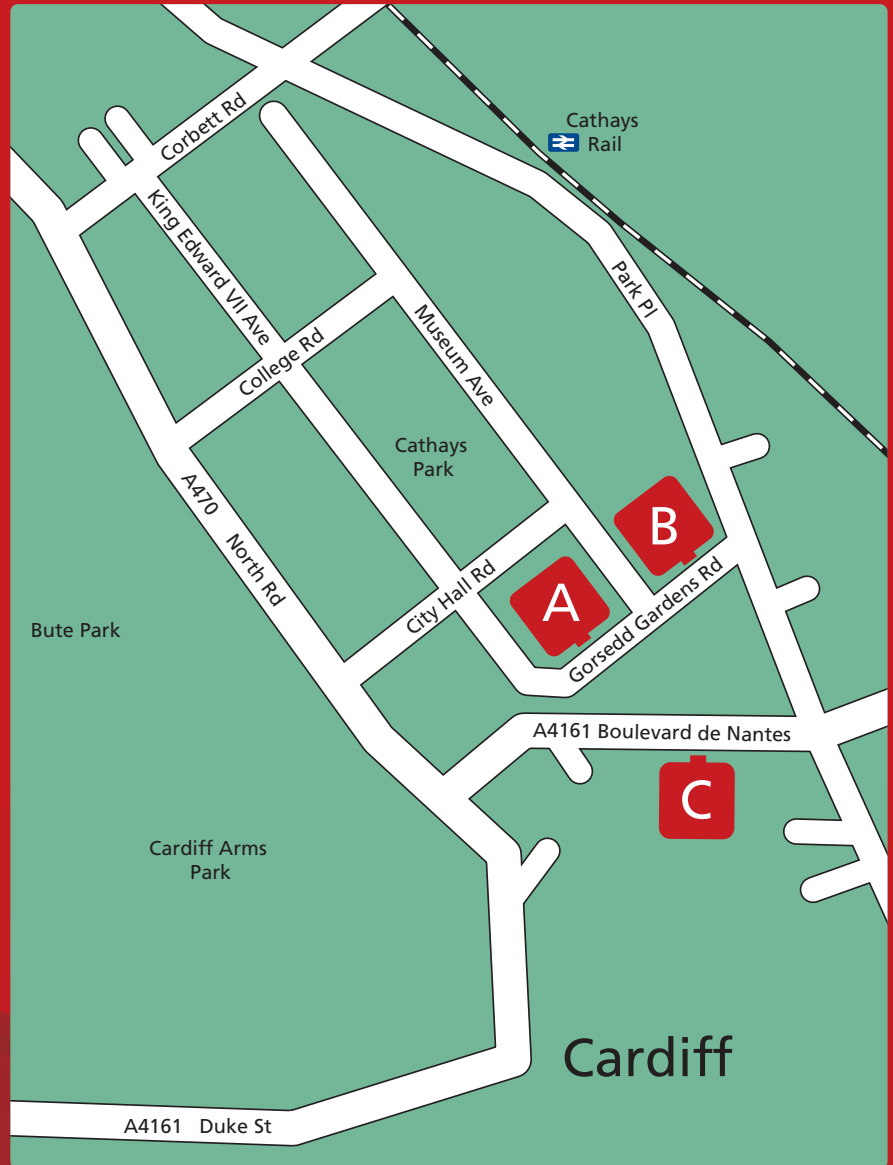
