Main Meeting Speakers

Dr Shazad Saleem



Shazad Saleem graduated from St Bartholomew's and the Royal London School of Medicine and Dentistry in 2002. Having completed his vocational training and a year as an SHO in Maxillofacial Surgery, he returned to General Dental Practice where he completed his MFDS examination. He now operates four dental practices in the North West of England with three other partners, delivering NHS dental care in some of the most deprived areas in the North West. He has been involved in a number of projects including the original service redesign pilot in Oldham and Salford. He is currently Chair of the Perio Subgroup for Greater Manchester LDN and has been leading the development of implementing an evidence-based care pathway approach for managing Periodontal Disease into NHS Dental practice called *Healthy Gums DO Matter*. He has recently completed a Masters in Research (MDPH (MRes)) at the University of Manchester, as a part of an In-Practice Fellowship training award from the NIHR,

looking into abbreviated oral plaque and bleeding scores which were developed as a part of the *Healthy Gums DO Matter* toolkit. He also delivers a training programme on how to implement Health Gums DO Matter into practice with Primary Care Commissioning (PCC). His current work includes the recent launch of the second edition of the HGDM toolkit and the *Medical Histories DO Matter* project for Greater Manchester LDN.

Dr Lloyd Searson



Lloyd Searson graduated in 1980 from the Welsh National School of Medicine, Cardiff.

Following graduation, he continued to work at the school in the departments of Oral Surgery and Conservative Dentistry, before accepting a post in the department of Conservative Dentistry at the Eastman Dental Institute. In 1983 he enrolled onto the Master of Science in Restorative Dentistry program at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor, USA. After completing his MS in 1985, Lloyd returned to work at The Eastman Dental Hospital and Institute where he has been a Consultant and Honorary Senior Lecturer in the Prosthodontics department for over twenty years. In addition to his time spent at the practice, Lloyd lectures nationally and internationally in all aspects of prosthodontics and implant dentistry, and has co-authored two books on the subject. He continues to treat cases and teach within the hospital setting as a Consultant in Restorative Dentistry at Kings College Dental Hospital. He has been Past President of both the American Dental Societies of London and Europe.

He continues to be an Examiner for a number of the Royal Colleges.

Professor Francesco Mannocci



Professor Francesco Mannocci (MD, DDS, PhD, FHEA) is a Specialist in Endodontics and Restorative Dentistry. He obtained his MD (Pisa, Italy, 1986) and DDS (Pisa, 1990) in Italy, and his PhD in Clinical Dentistry from King's College London in 2001. After having worked in private practice in Pisa for 18 years while collaborating with the University of Siena as a Visiting Professor he became Lecturer in Endodontology at King's College London in 2004, Senior lecturer/Honorary Consultant in 2006, Head of Endodontology in 2008, and Professor of Endodontology at King's College London in 2011. He has authored more than 120 papers in international peer reviewed journals and is Associate Editor of the International Endodontic Journal.

His research work has focused on subjects including restoration of endodontically treated teeth, instrumentation techniques, dental anatomy, histology, endodontic radiology and endodontic microbiology. Professor Mannocci maintains a private practice limited to Endodontics in Central London.

Mr Matthew Jerreat



Matthew Jerreat qualified in dentistry at Bristol University in 1999 and completed his Fellowship in Restorative Dentistry in 2006 (Royal College Surgeons, Edinburgh). He provides management of patients with head and neck cancer and developmental disorders. His specialist interests include multidisciplinary care of patients with orthodontic-restorative needs and the rehabilitation of cancer patients with dental implants. As the Managed Clinical Network chair in Restorative Dentistry for the Southwest, Matthew is developing a network across the region to help provide specialist services to all patients and improve quality of care. Matthew has a passion for education; he is clinical lead for the Exeter Education Facility and Associate Professor in Clinical Education in Plymouth University, he is responsible for the implant dentistry modules for the postgraduate cert/diploma/masters in Restorative Dentistry and Periodontology, and is the Training Program Director for Restorative Dentistry in the Southwest and Honorary Secretary of the British Society for Restorative Dentistry, both of which allows him to share his

enthusiasm for his specialty.

Professor Martin Ashley



Prof Martin Ashley has been a Consultant in Restorative Dentistry in Manchester since 2002. He has clinical and research interests in hypodontia, cleft, periodontology and oral health improvement. He also has Trust leadership roles in clinical informatics and in clinical ethics.

Martin is Chairman of RD-UK and was previously chairman of SRRDG.

He is the consultant lead for the RD-UK Hypodontia CEN and is developing the Hypodontia Clinical Research Network.

Dr Lorna McCaul



Lorna McCaul is currently Consultant and Honorary Clinical Senior Lecturer in Restorative Dentistry at Glasgow Dental Hospital and School. She is the Secretary and Head and Neck Cancer CEN Lead for RD-UK and is President of the British Society of Prosthodontics (BSSPD). She has delivered Specialist Restorative care in Dental Hospitals, District General Hospitals and Private Referral Practice settings in Scotland, the North of England and London. Her main interest is oral pre-habilitation and rehabilitation for Head and Neck Cancer patients. She has worked in Head and Neck Cancer MDTs at Bradford Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, The Royal Marsden, Guy's and St Thomas' and Northwick Park Hospitals in London and in Crosshouse Hospital in Scotland. She instigated and led the development of the first national oral rehabilitation Guideline for Head and Neck Cancer; "Predicting and Managing Oral and Dental Complications of Surgical and Non-Surgical Treatment for Head and Neck Cancer" which has now been disseminated in the UK. She has published and presented research both in the UK and abroad. She wrote the Restorative Dentistry chapters in the 5th and 6th editions of the Oxford Handbook of Clinical Dentistry

and is actively involved in Postgraduate and Undergraduate teaching and training.

Dr Sandip Popat



Sandip qualified with a Bachelor in Dental Surgery (BDS) from University College London (UCL) in December 1991.

He worked in general dental practice for seven years and then went onto further specialist training. He gained a Fellowship in Dental Surgery (FDS RCPS) from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons in Glasgow in 1998 and then undertook a three year full time specialist training programme in Fixed and Removable Prosthodontics at the Eastman Dental Institute in London. In 2000, he gained a Masters in Clinical Dentistry (MClinDent) in fixed and removable Prosthodontics from UCL, London; the Membership examination (MRD RCS) in 2001 and entry onto the GDC specialist list in Prosthodontics before continuing training in Restorative Dentistry at the Eastman for a further 4 years. He gained a further Fellowship (FDS (Rest Dent)) in 2004 and entry onto the GDC specialist lists of Restorative Dentistry, Endodontics and Periodontology.

In 2005, he was appointed to a new post as the first full-time Consultant in Restorative Dentistry at the John Radcliffe Hospital, Oxford to treat patients with cleft lip and palate, oral cancer, trauma and hypodontia. Sandip has been involved in treating patients with cleft lip and palate for over twenty years and set up the Cleft Clinical Excellence Network, of which he is currently the chair.

He is an examiner for the Royal College of Surgeons of England and is the Regional Specialty advisor for Restorative Dentistry in his region. He has undertaken Medico-legal work for many years and in 2015, he completed the Bond Solon Expert Witness training.

Dr Mike Harrison



Mike graduated from Cardiff Dental School and completed specialist training in paediatric dentistry at Guy's Dental Hospital. Participation in a hypodontia clinic led to molecular genetic studies of dental anomalies at the Institute of Child Health, following which he has developed a particular interest in dental developmental disorders and the syndromic dentition.

Mike has held Consultant posts at the Eastman Dental Institute, King's College London, and is currently Consultant at Guy's and St Thomas' Hospitals and the Evelina London Children's Hospital. He chaired the UK national clinical guidelines committee for paediatric dentistry, and was the lead author for the first guideline for dental management of children under general anaesthesia. He is a regular speaker at international conferences and runs postgraduate workshops on problem-solving in paediatric dentistry. He works in the Rare Diseases Centre at St Thomas', the paediatric skeletal dysplasia service, is a board member of the UK Ectodermal Dysplasia Association and has been with the Guy's hypodontia multidisciplinary team for 25 years.

Professor Avijit Bannerjee



Avijit is Professor of Cariology & Operative Dentistry / Hon. Consultant in Restorative Dentistry and Clinical Undergraduate Team Clinical Lead at the Faculty of Dentistry, Oral & Craniofacial Sciences, King's College London / Guy's & St. Thomas' Hospitals Foundation Trust, London, UK.

He holds the positions of Head of Conservative & MI Dentistry, Director of Education (UG) and Programme Director of the innovative KCL distance-learning Masters in Advanced Minimum Intervention Dentistry. He also leads the Cariology & Operative Dentistry research programme at the world-leading Faculty, researching, publishing and lecturing internationally about MI operative caries management and adhesive dental biomaterials. He has published his extensively and widely and is active in reader he and the supervision of students at Master, PhD and post doctorate levels and acts as an international R&D key opinion leader for many international Industry partners.

Avijit is primary author of Pickard's Guide to Minimally Invasive Operative Dentistry, amongst other book editorships and chapter contributions. He is editor-in-chief of Oral Health & Preventive Dentistry (Quintessence Ltd), an editorial board member of numerous dental Journals and is a member of the British Dental Association Health & Science Committee also, all whilst maintaining wet-fingered specialist clinical practice in Restorative Dentistry, Prosthodontics & Periodontics.
